Mouth of the Canyon Trail

Description: Moderate, 3-Miles Round Trip
 On the north end of Loop B (to your left if you are facing the water). In the Horseshoe Bend Campground you will find a service road that leads toward a water storage tank. Follow this road until it meets up with an abandoned road that veers off to the right just before you reach the water storage tank. Follow this abandoned road to where Crooked Creek runs into the canyon. Double back through a juniper lined draw to the top of the ridge. Follow the cairns back to the old road just east (left) of the water tank. This trail offers spectacular views of the Pryor and Bighorn Mountains and the red badlands surrounding Horseshoe Bend.

State Line Trail

Description: Easy to Moderate, 1 Mile Round Trip
 Just north of the Montana State line, you will find a cairn marking the beginning of this trail. Follow the cairns along an old road that leads to the rim of the canyon. You may then follow the canyon rim for several hundred feet. This trail leads through juniper forest and limestone plateaus to unique views of the canyon.

Lower Layout Creek Trail

Description: Easy to Moderate, Approximately 3.5 Miles Round Trip
 The end of the Wild Horse Range is marked with a cattle guard. Follow an old two-track road, which begins to the right of the cattle guard and runs parallel to Layout Creek, to the juncture where Layout Creek Canyon joins with Bighorn Canyon. You may then follow the canyon rim for several hundred feet. This hike offers several opportunities to stray from the main trail and view Layout Creek Canyon and offers spectacular views of Bighorn Canyon as well. This trail is also located in the Pryor Mountain Wild Horse Range, so there is a possibility of viewing some wild horses from afar. Ultimately, this road loops in a horse-shoe shape and meets the main road approximately .5 miles from where the two-track road began. However, you may alternately follow a well trodden horse trail which begins near the canyon rims and eventually re-joins the two-track road near its beginning. This route will shorten your round trip hike to approximately 3 miles.

left side of the road marked "historic site." Turn off here and follow the road into the parking area east (left) of the corrals. Go through the corrals and follow an old road along Layout Creek to where the creek enters Layout Creek Canyon. This trail goes between a limestone plateau and a lush river area up to the base of East Pryor Mountain.

Barry's Island Trail

Description: Moderate, 5 Miles Round Trip
 Follow the turnoff for Barry's Landing until the road dead ends in a parking area. To the north (your left if you are facing into the parking area), you will see a red road leading away from the parking area. Follow this road 1/4 of a mile until you meet a gate. On foot, follow this road until it submerges underwater. You will then see a game wall, which will lead you to where the road emerges. Continue on the old road about half a mile beyond the Medicine Creek Campground to Wasson Canyon.

Lockhart Ranch

Description: Easy, 1.5 Miles Round Trip
 Beyond Barry's Landing, Highway 37 becomes a dirt road. Follow this dirt road 2.5 miles to Lockhart Ranch. You may park in the pull-out across from the gate to the ranch. To the left of the gate you will find a cutout in the fence. Use this to gain access to the ranch. Beyond the gate you will find a kiosk and a trail into the ranch. East (left) of the corrals, you will find a garage, which lies just north of an old road that runs along Davis Creek and offers views of the Pryor Mountains. At the end of this trail, take a left to continue on the main dirt road, which meets up with the main road, or follow the Davis Creek Trail back to the ranch. Then take a right to finish the loop through the ranch and head back to the parking area.

Om-Ne-A Trail

This is a rim-top trail that provides some awesome views of the magnificent Bighorn Canyon. The 3-mile trail goes from Yellowtail Dam to Ok-A-Beh marina. The trail starts at Yellowtail Dam and is steep for the first quarter mile.
